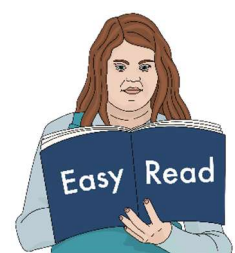

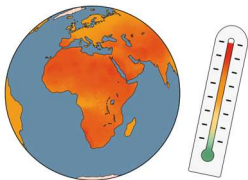

The artists are sending a message to Earth.

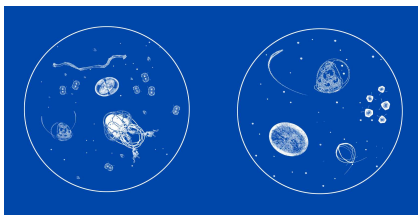


They want people to think about how we care for the planet.

- Photography

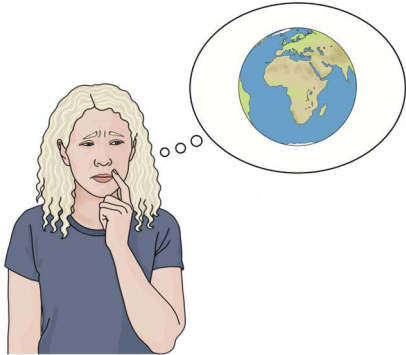
- Printmaking

The world today

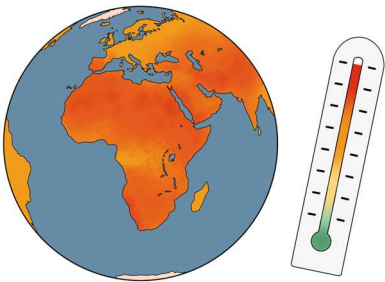


Many people are worried about the future of our planet.

They are worried about:

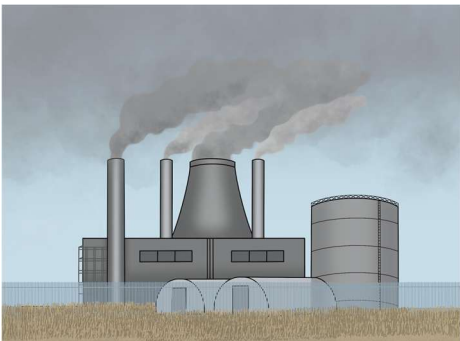
- **Climate change**

They remind us that we can take action to protect Earth. We can change things and make them better.

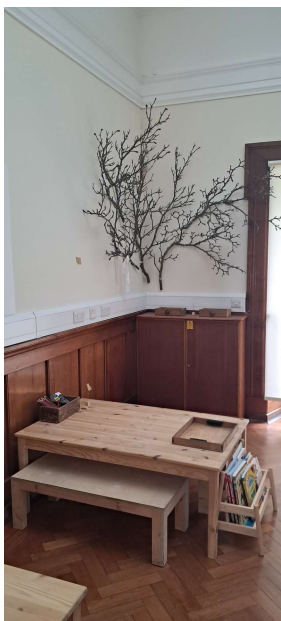


It is okay to feel unsure about the future.

Climate Care Corner



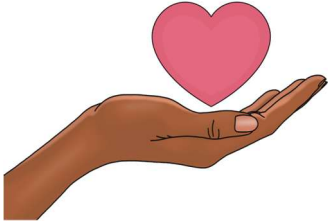
There is a **Climate Care Corner** in the gallery.

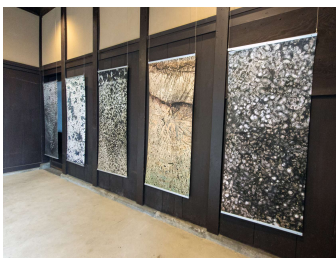

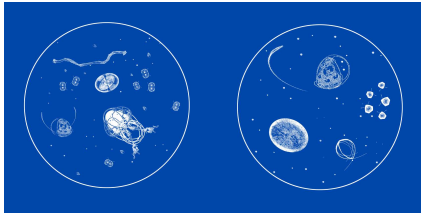
