If you need any help, you can ask the gallery staff.



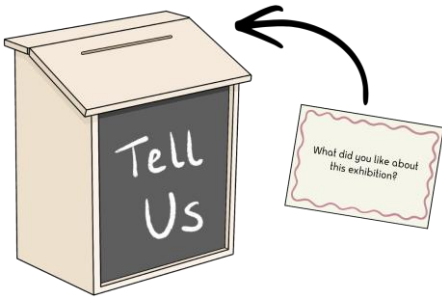
If you want to know more about the art or the artists, there is a book called **About the Artists**. You can ask the staff to help you read it.



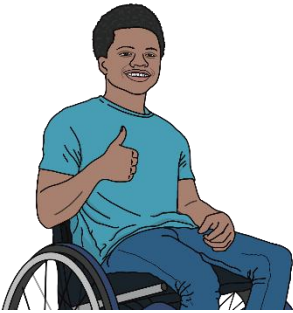
On the table in the gallery, there are some hand-made books. The artists made these together.



You can touch the books and look through them.

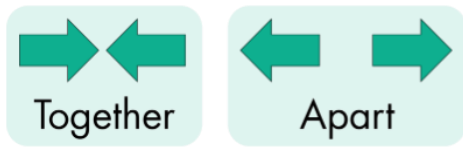

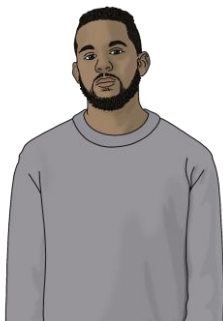
What is Together | Apart about?



This exhibition is called **Together | Apart**.



Together means being connected to other people.



Apart means being separate or on your own.



Sometimes people feel like they are both at the same time.

People can feel different ways at the same time about these experiences.



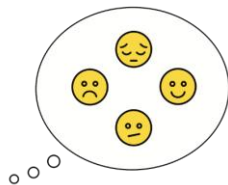
Being with others is not always good.

The art in the show was made by artists from **Neuk Collective**. **Neuk Collective** is a group of **neurodivergent** artists.



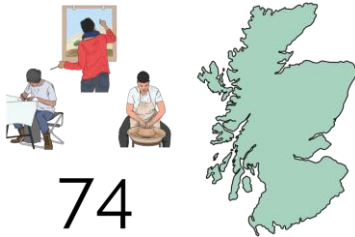
Neurodivergent means having a brain that works differently from most people's.
